Our fondness for all things Alsace and double entendres is alive and well. Elder Vicar refers to our own Father Pandosy (the first chap to plant wine grapes in BC), but is also a riff on the Alsatian wine known as "edelzwicker" meaning a "noble blend" of Riesling, Gewürztraminer, Pinot Gris, and Muscat.

> "Clos St. Hune" - our homage to one of the most iconic vineyards in Alsace, which has been making wine in this style since 1626-ish.

Father Pandosy was the first European settler in the Okanagan. He noted that the land appeared fertile and bounteous, thus planting the first vines in the region to provide a little tipple for the sacrament.

> Flower power. Reminiscent of the hallmark aromas of this style.
